



Fortification has merits

This refers to the article 'Supply snags' (16-31 October, 2021) Fortification is a cost-effective practice used to deliberately increase the content of essential micronutrients, that is, vitamins and minerals (including trace elements) in any food item. South Africa fortifies maize meal, China soy sauce and Vietnam fish sauce. In India as well, external fortification of wheat distributed through the public distribution system (PDS) is a well-established practice. Also, private player TATA Chemicals Limited has joined with the Indian Council of Medical Research-National Institute of Nutrition in Hyderabad, Telangana, to launch fortified salt containing iron and iodine to prevent anaemia—a condition affecting two of three women in the country—prophylaxis and endemic goitre Various states have also independently undertaken food fortification with help from global support groups.

With regard to rice, if is important that the authorities select appropriate technology and methods for fortification. The fortified rice needs good stability during transport and storage. It should also be able to retain added micronutrients during cooking and preparation, so that it is absorbed while consumption effectively. Consumers must also learn to accept and actively opt for fortified rice.






Late Dr. Anima Sen (1938-1995)
