



**Abstract:** The article aims to estimate the relationship between synergy gains and deal size of mergers & acquisitions for Indian firms by examining deals that took place between 2005 and 2015. The paper employs principal component analysis to create a composite variable representing operating and financial synergy followed by instrument variable 2SLS regression to estimate the relationship. The results suggest that small deal-size transactions do considerably better than large deals. The magnitude of financial synergy increases with deal size. However, large companies suffer substantial operating synergistic erosion.

Further, anxiety (Covid-19) partially mediates the relationship between financial strain and suicidal ideation.
